Target/Specificity

Recognizes the human CD54 cell surface antigen, a 90kD glycoprotein also known as ICAM-1. CD54 is expressed by many cells following activation by inflammatory mediators. Clone 3H1547 blocks CD54 function.

Reconstitution & Storage

+4°C or -20°C, Avoid repeated freezing and thawing.

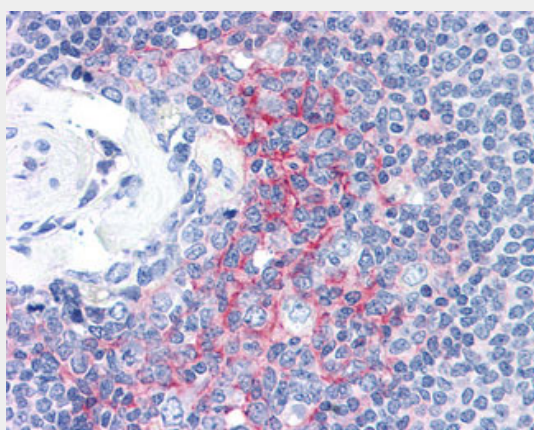

In case of rhinovirus infection acts as a cellular receptor for the virus.
