Description

The protein encoded by this gene is secreted and is a serine protease inhibitor whose targets include elastase, plasmin, thrombin, trypsin, chymotrypsin, and plasminogen activator. Defects in this gene can cause emphysema or liver disease. Several transcript variants encoding the same protein have been found for this gene.

Immunogen

Purified recombinant fragment of human SERPINA1 (AA: 23-237) expressed in E. Coli.

Formulation

Purified antibody in PBS with 0.05% sodium azide

SERPINA1 Antibody - Protein Information

Name SERPINA1 (HGNC:8941)

Synonyms AAT, PI

Function

Inhibitor of serine proteases. Its primary target is elastase, but it also has a moderate affinity for plasmin and thrombin. Irreversibly inhibits trypsin, chymotrypsin and plasminogen activator. The aberrant form inhibits insulin-induced NO synthesis in platelets, decreases coagulation time and has proteolytic activity against insulin and plasmin.

Cellular Location

Secreted. Endoplasmic reticulum. Note=The S and Z allele are not secreted effectively and accumulate intracellularly in the endoplasmic reticulum

Tissue Location

Ubiquitous. Expressed in leukocytes and plasma.
