Purified polyclonal antibody supplied in PBS with 0.09% (W/V) sodium azide. This antibody is purified through a protein A column, followed by peptide affinity purification.

Storage

Maintain refrigerated at 2-8°C for up to 2 weeks. For long term storage store at -20°C in small aliquots to prevent freeze-thaw cycles.

Cellular Location

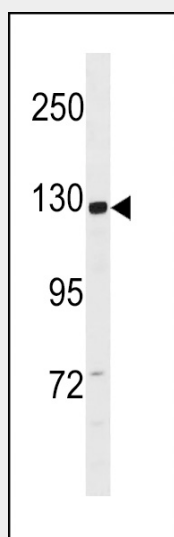
Cytoplasm, cytoskeleton, microtubule organizing center, centrosome, centriolar satellite.

Note=Colocalizes with PCM1 at centriolar satellites throughout the cell cycle.
