Store at -20°C or lower. Aliquot to avoid repeated freezing and thawing.

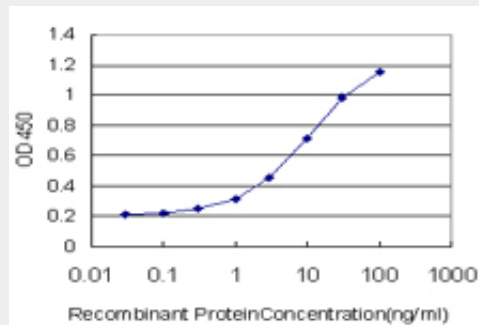
