RAP2B Antibody (Center) Blocking Peptide - Protein Information

Name RAP2B

Function

Small GTP-binding protein which cycles between a GDP-bound inactive and a GTP-bound active form. Involved in EGFR and CHRM3 signaling pathways through stimulation of PLCE1. May play a role in cytoskeletal rearrangements and regulate cell spreading through activation of the effector TNIK. May regulate membrane vesiculation in red blood cells.

Cellular Location

Recycling endosome membrane; Lipid-anchor; Cytoplasmic side. Note=Associated with red blood cells- released vesicles

Tissue Location

Expressed in red blood cells (at protein level).

RAP2B Antibody (Center) Blocking Peptide - Background

This intronless gene belongs to a family of RAS-relatedgenes. The proteins encoded by these genes share approximately 50% amino acid identity with the classical RAS proteins and havenumerous structural features in common. The most striking difference between the RAP and RAS proteins resides in their 61 stamino acid: glutamine in RAS is replaced by threonine in RAP proteins. Evidence suggests that this protein may be polyisoprenylated and palmitoylated.
