Name SIRPB1

Function

Immunoglobulin-like cell surface receptor involved in the negative regulation of receptor tyrosine kinase-coupled signaling processes. Participates also in the recruitment of tyrosine kinase SYK. Triggers activation of myeloid cells when associated with TYROBP (PubMed:10604985).

Cellular Location

Cell membrane; Single-pass type I membrane protein

Tissue Location

Detected in monocytes and dendritic cells.

SIRPB1 Antibody (Center) Blocking Peptide - Background

The protein encoded by this gene is a member of thesignal-regulatory-protein (SIRP) family, and also belongs to theimmunoglobulin superfamily. SIRP family members are receptor-typetransmembrane glycoproteins known to be involved in the negativeregulation of receptor tyrosine kinase-coupled signaling processes. This protein was found to interact with TYROBP/DAP12, a proteinbearing immunoreceptor tyrosine-based activation motifs. This protein was also reported to participate in the recruitment of tyrosine kinase SYK. Multiple transcript variants encoding different isoforms have been found for this gene. [provided byRefSeq].
