Name CBLN4

Synonyms CBLNL1

Function

Acts as a synaptic organizer in specific subsets of neurons in the brain (By similarity). Essential for the formation and maintenance of inhibitory GABAergic synapses (By similarity). Promotes the development of dendrite-targeting inhibitory GABAergic synapses made by somatostatin-positive interneurons (By similarity). May contribute to the function of ventral medial habenula region of the brain implicated in the regulation of anxiety-related behaviors (By similarity). May play a role in CBLN3 export from the endoplasmic reticulum and secretion (By similarity).

CBLN4 Antibody (C-term) Blocking Peptide - Background

Cerebellin is a sixteen aa peptide found mainly in the adrenal medulla, where it has been shown to have a neuromodulatory function. Cerebellin is derived from precerebellin, a protein with sequence similarity to the noncollagen domain of complement component C1qB. The protein is a glycoprotein which shares sequence similarity with precerebellin.
