Target/Specificity

The synthetic peptide sequence used to generate the antibody [AP7107b](/product/products/AP7107b) was selected from the C-term region of human ADCK4. A 10 to 100 fold molar excess to antibody is recommended. Precise conditions should be optimized for a particular assay.

Format

Peptides are lyophilized in a solid powder format. Peptides can be reconstituted in solution using the appropriate buffer as needed.

Storage

Maintain refrigerated at 2-8°C for up to 6 months. For long term storage store at -20°C.

ADCK4 Antibody (C-term) Blocking Peptide - Protein InformationName COQ8B ([HGNC:19041](#))**Function**

Atypical kinase involved in the biosynthesis of coenzyme Q, also named ubiquinone, an essential lipid-soluble electron transporter for aerobic cellular respiration (PubMed: [24270420](http://www.uniprot.org/citations/24270420)). Its substrate specificity is unclear: does not show any protein kinase activity. Probably acts as a small molecule kinase, possibly a lipid kinase that phosphorylates a prenyl lipid in the ubiquinone biosynthesis pathway. Required for podocyte migration (PubMed: [24270420](http://www.uniprot.org/citations/24270420)).

Cellular Location

Mitochondrion membrane; Single-pass membrane protein. Cytoplasm, cytosol. Cell membrane

Tissue Location

Widely expressed, including renal podocytes.
