### Target/Specificity

The synthetic peptide sequence is selected from aa 352~367 of human TSSK1.

#### **Format**

Peptides are lyophilized in a solid powder format. Peptides can be reconstituted in solution using the appropriate buffer as needed.

#### Storage

Maintain refrigerated at 2-8°C for up to 6 months. For long term storage store at -20°C.

### TSSK1 Antibody (Center) Blocking Peptide - Protein Information

### Name TSSK1B

Synonyms SPOGA1, SPOGA4, STK22A, STK22D, TSSK1

### **Function**

Testis-specific serine/threonine-protein kinase required during spermatid development. Phosphorylates 'Ser-288' of TSKS. Involved in the late stages of spermatogenesis, during the reconstruction of the cytoplasm. During spermatogenesis, required for the transformation of a ring-shaped structure around the base of the flagellum originating from the chromatoid body.

### **Cellular Location**

Cytoplasm. Cytoplasmic vesicle, secretory vesicle, acrosome. Cell projection, cilium, flagellum. Note=In spermatozoa, present in the sperm head and in the flagellum.

### **Tissue Location**

Testis-specific. Present in sperm (at protein level).
