### **BAK1 Blocking Peptide - Protein Information**

Name BAK1

Synonyms BAK, BCL2L7, CDN1

Function

Plays a role in the mitochondrial apoptotic process. Upon arrival of cell death signals, promotes



mitochondrial outer membrane (MOM) permeabilization by oligomerizing to form pores within the MOM. This releases apoptogenic factors into the cytosol, including cytochrome c, promoting the activation of caspase 9 which in turn processes and activates the effector caspases.

## **Cellular Location**

Mitochondrion outer membrane; Single-pass membrane protein

#### **Tissue Location**

Expressed in a wide variety of tissues, with highest levels in the heart and skeletal muscle
